2011 Real Heroes

Award Criteria

Youth Hero

This award pays tribute to a person, high school age or younger, who has stepped forward in a time of crisis to help another person, or has worked toward the betterment of our community by taking action to help improve someone's quality of life, helped someone avoid a crisis or performed a lifesaving action serving as an example for other youth.

Good Samaritan Hero

This award is presented to an individual who, through their actions, helped another in time of emergency. Individuals nominated in this category either used lifesaving skills such as CPR, water rescue or first aid to assist someone in crisis, or they reached out to help another person, providing a safe and secure environment to ensure the person's well-being.

Corporate Hero

This award recognizes a business which has demonstrated outstanding contributions to health, safety and well-being of the community through philanthropic actions or humanitarian service.

Emergency Response Hero

This award recognizes a public sector career or volunteer responder who has demonstrated an outstanding level of service to their community beyond the usual scope of their duties. This category includes those serving as fire fighters, emergency medical technicians and/or first responders. He/she may be someone on or off-duty at the time of the incident.

Law Enforcement Hero

This award recognizes a law enforcement professional who has demonstrated an outstanding level of service to the people of their community beyond the usual scope of their duties. This nominee could be on or off-duty at the time of the incident.

Health Care Hero

Nurses, doctors, physician's assistants and others working in the healthcare field are among those eligible for this award. This award honors a person who has demonstrated an outstanding level of service to the people of their community beyond the usual scope of their duties. The nominee could be on or off-duty at the time of the incident.

Community Hero

This award pays tribute to a community member who has made significant contributions through sharing his or her talents, expertise and leadership for the betterment of the community. Their work may have taken place over a span of many months, years or decades.

OTHER

Use this category if you are unsure where your nominee best fits. The Selection Committee will determine the appropriate award designation.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

1. The act of courage or humanitarian service can be ongoing OR have occurred anytime after January 1, 2009.
2. Nominees must reside, work or be active in Clark, Lincoln, Marathon, Portage, Taylor or Wood County or the acts of courage or humanitarian service must have occurred in one of these counties.
3. Award winners will be asked to participate in interviews and photographs for media and promotional purposes.
4. Entries may be submitted by mail, fax or e-mail.
