Award Criteria

Youth Hero

This award pays tribute to a person, high school age or younger, who has stepped forward in a time of crisis to help another person, or has worked toward the betterment of our community by taking action to help improve someone's quality of life, helped someone avoid a crisis or performed a lifesaving action serving as an example for other youth.

Community Hero

This award is presented to an individual who used personal knowledge and/or skills to come to the aid of another person. Individuals nominated in this category either used lifesaving skills such as CPR water rescue or first aid to assist someone in crisis, or they reached out to help another person, providing a safe and secure environment to ensure the person's well-being.

Law Enforcement Hero

This award recognizes a law enforcement professional who has demonstrated an outstanding level of service to the people of their community beyond the usual scope of their duties. This nominee could be on or off-duty at the time of the incident.

Emergency Response Hero

This award recognizes a public sector career or volunteer responder who has demonstrated an outstanding level of service to their community beyond the usual scope of their duties. This category includes those serving as fire fighters, emergency medical technicians and/or first responders. He/she may be someone on or off-duty at the time of the incident.

Health Care Hero

Nurses, doctors, physician's assistants and others working in the healthcare field are among those eligible for this award. This award honors a person who has demonstrated an outstanding level of service to the people of their community beyond the usual scope of their duties. The nominee could be on or off-duty at the time of the incident.

Corporate Hero

This award recognizes a business which truly understands that it must take a stake in ensuring the health and well-being of our community either through philanthropic actions or activities and/or support of employee involvement in the community.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

1. The act of courage or humanitarian service can be ongoing OR have occurred anytime after January 1, 2009.
2. Nominees must reside, work or be active in Forest, Langlade, Oneida, Price or Vilas County. OR the acts of courage or humanitarian service must have occurred in these counties.
3. Award winners must be willing to participate in interviews and photographs for media and promotional purposes.
4. Entries may be submitted by mail, fax or e-mail.
